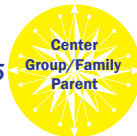

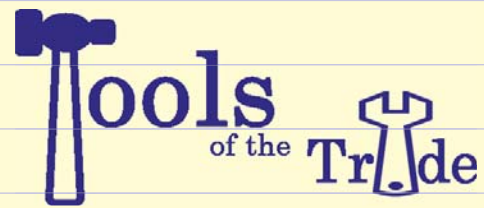

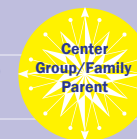

Emergency Medication Administration

In May of 2009, OCFS developed a waiver for emergency medication administration of Epi-Pens, asthma inhalers, and nebulizers to accommodate children that fall under the ADA guidelines. Part of the requirement for this waiver includes training in the administration of these medications. This workshop deals with these specific medications and the safety issues involved. Participants will learn what information is important to have from the physician and what items to include on the Special Needs Care Plan.
