Pre-Registration & Payment

All registrations must be paid in advance. Payment by Visa, MasterCard, check, cash, money order and signed EIP awards are accepted. Use credit cards by mail or by fax at 518 426-9649. Registrations received without payment will be returned. Pre-registration is recommended 3 days in advance of the workshop date to reserve your seat. Registration at the door will be accepted only if seating is available and all fees must be paid at that time.

Membership Rates

Payment at the member rate is only available when your current membership number is noted or when membership payment is made along with the registration fee. If registering at the door, a current membership card must be shown to receive the reduced member rate. Membership fees paid after December 15 will be valid for the following year.
